Translation apps



If someone in your family, or another school parent or carer that you know of, struggles with reading school documents in English, then we recommend the use of "Google Translate" on your smartphone or tablet (available on both Android and Apple devices.) This will allow you to translate documents to a chosen language via the camera on your device.



Meal price change

You will be aware of the recent rises in food costs. Despite these pressures, we have avoided raising our school meal prices for over a year (the last change was a 2% rise in January 2022), but we cannot continue subsidising school lunches from our main school budget. This means that we will be raising prices by 9% from £2.20 to £2.40 from the start of the summer term. Prices remain unchanged for the rest of this term up to the Easter Holidays.

We have worked with our caterers this year to improve the standard of food offered and, for this price, children have a choice of two main meals or jacket potatoes and a choice of fruit or dessert.

Operation Encompass

Our school is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces. Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced domestic abuse.

As a school, we have ensured that a member of our staff, Mr Finch, known as a Key Adult, has been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the children in our care.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this scheme is extremely beneficial for all those involved. It has already helped us support a number of children and their families.

Highlights from January & February

January RE Week

Year 3 Visit to St Francis Church

Early in the New Year, Year 3 classes visited nearby St Francis' Church as part of their RE studies. They walked there to have a look around the building and to ask the vicar, Reverend Josias, questions about being a Christian priest.



The children looked around the pulpit, baptistry and altar table. They got to try out the pipe organ and learned about the unique artwork. Josias got some of them to act out a baptism - something they had learned about in lessons back in school.



Year 4 Shabbat meal and guest speaker

The day after Year 3 visited the local church, Year 4 received a visit from Mr Green, chairman of the local synagogue. He spoke to the children about some of the traditions of Judaism, especially Shabbat meals. Later in the week, the children organised their own Shabbat meal to enjoy together.

On 12th January, we were privileged to host a visit from Pete Thompson of Skip Beatz fame. Pete is a local man who is a five time skipping world record holder. In assembly, he amazed us with his skipping ninja show and then talked to us about how he had taught himself skipping tricks and practised until he became a skipping champion.



During the day, each class had a skipping lesson from Pete. Some children learned to skip for the first time, while others developed their skills and learned new tricks.



Blues for Loos

Year 3 raised £97 for toilet twinning projects through their Blues for Loos day and from sales of their nativity play programmes.

The theme for this forum was debating. The lower school houses debated whether Goldilocks was a criminal. The upper phase houses debated whether football players are overpaid.


The children looked at points on each side of the debate and drew up strong arguments in favour of their chosen viewpoints.


