



### Price increase to school dinners



Due to the rising prices of ingredients and labour, our caterers have informed us that they are making a small increase in the price of school meals. (The price has not been raised since 2019!).

From the start of next term, the price will be £2.20 per meal. (The actual cost of the meals is £2.85 but we subsidise this so that families only pay £2.20)




### Remembrance - Year 6 Class Assembly





### Winter weather clothing
