#### **Looking forward**



#### Covid measures - what to do if your child is ill or someone at home tests positive

Despite the recent increase in Covid cases locally, we have managed to avoid cases spreading widely in school. We want to keep it this way to keep children safe, to maintain a good staffing level and avoid class closures.

A substantial recent survey showed that the top five symptoms of people with the Omicron variant are runny nose, headache, fatigue, sneezing and sore throat - much like many other seasonal illness. What can seem like a normal cold could be Covid. We ask, therefore, that you do not send your child into school with any such illness until they have first had a PCR test. If this test is negative and your child is well enough to attend school they can then come into school as usual. If a household member tests positive, please call the school office before sending your child into school. We have been very grateful for the cooperation of parents and carers with managing children who are ill or need to self-isolate, as this has kept our school much safer. Our thanks also go to parents and carers for their support for our measures including wearing a face covering on school site and leaving the site promptly.

Thank you to families who have been doing weekly lateral flow tests with their children as this has worked well in catching some Covid cases before children come on site. Please continue with this ©

### Trampolining Report

On our trampoline trip, we went to Gravity Trampoline Park. We played on different activities such as obstacle courses, trampolines, games and many more. Upstairs was a little cafe. We also had drinks there.

Our first activity was the Obstacle Course. In this activity, we had to climb, walk and slide on different things. We had some time on it and then we moved on to the next activity. We had to run on a trampoline and jump on a pillow-like air bag. There were also soft sticks that each pupil had and they had to hit each other's sticks hoping that the other opponent would fall. This was called Warrior Battle.

After that, we went on a smaller obstacle course. There were three climbing platforms from high to small. In this, we had to run to any of the platforms and had to jump and get on top of it then slide down on the slide. On the side of the obstacle course, there was a climbing wall and beside that, there was a mini game. There are two teams, red and green and there were several sticks with lights on them. The lights turned red and green and, whatever team you are on, you have to press the light that has that colour. The last thing we were on was the trampolines.

#### Boys football tournament





