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Head Teacher's Comment

Getting back to normal (again!)

The Omicron Covid wave continued to plague us during the first part of February, when many children were off school. I was pleased to see that, towards the end of the month, things got much better. By the last Friday of the month, our attendance was back up to 98.3%. We have been able to reintroduce phase assemblies, trips and activities and this half term will see children involved in lots of events such as Science Week, World Book Day, Mother's Day Sale, and (for Year 5) Bikeability. We will be entering a number of teams for different sports events and Year 6 children will have their residential outdoor activity trip on the Suffolk coast.

Great progress in learning

Our Year 6 children have sat a number of sets of 'mock SATs' over the last year. These give them a chance to practise the types of test that they will sit in May, and their scores in the different sets of papers help them to see their progress from term to term. In the February set of mock tests, the current Year 6 outperformed previous years in their results for this time of year. Given that this year group lost so much time to lockdowns in Years 4 and 5, these results were a great testament to the hard work of the children and the support of their teachers since they have been back in school. I have set them the realistic challenge of getting our best results *ever* in May – they seem eager to rise to the challenge!

Highlights from February

New recycling scheme

Last term, our Eco Committee launched our improved recycling scheme. As well as encouraging us all to use the recycling bins more effectively, they introduced a new scheme for recycling items that could not previously be recycled. We have joined Bic's *Terracycle* project for recycling pens and whiteboard markers. These used to end up in landfill waste. At the end of last half term, they collected the special boxes from each class and bagged the waste plastic for collection.



Learning at home

Some children were confined to home while they isolated having tested positive for Covid. This did not stop their learning as they continued to connect with their teachers via Google Classroom. Teachers were impressed with work that the children submitted.



Boring but important: new car park surface

For a while now, we have been searching for a way to resurface our deteriorating and crumbling car park. We were pleased to secure £20,000 in funding for this from the local council this year, and over the February half term, the new car park surface and markings were installed.



Learning - Safer Internet Day

8th February was global Safer Internet Day and our children engaged in a range of activities during the week to help children reflect on how to keep themselves safe and how to be a positive presence online. Miss Xygaki, our Computing leader, began the week with an assembly that included a "Send/Don't Send" quiz about how to respond to various online situations.
