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
#### **Head Teacher's Comment**

Children in Year 4 created collages inspired by the work of the artist Henri Rousseau
















Year 3 - The impact of Pentecost on Christians

In April's RE week, Year 3 continued their learning about Christianity. They created a piece of work art showing what happened at








































#### Year 5 - What would Jesus do?

They show this by treating all their parent patients great and give free treatment so they are treated excellent by the people who thank them.


I feel Merry Ships are doing an excellent job becase they are going round to the poorer countries giving all the medication they need all for free.

## Learning - Biology: Parts of a flower


Year 5 have been learning about the parts of a flower. Here they have dissected some flowers and labelled


the parts that they have identified.
